WHO WE ARE

CHESS is a "two-in-one learning center" that brings together homeschooled families and students from our private school, KGCA, to create a fun and inspiring Christ-centered learning experience. We offer both in-person and virtual e-learning options.

Our Homeschool Co-op meets every Wednesday from 9 am to 4 pm. Our daily activities and programs are carefully designed to cater to the educational needs of homeschooling families from September through May. We arrange monthly educational and fun field trips for students. In addition, monthly support group meetings are scheduled for parents, and a quarterly moms' night out event is also organized.

Also, we host various events and workshops through our parent organization, EPIC Cafe (Empowering Parents Igniting Communities), in order to promote civic and political engagement. These carefully curated programs aim to encourage parents and the community to actively participate in the democratic process.

WHAT WE :.... CLASSES OFFER

We offer a wide range of enriching courses for pre-K to 12th-grade students. From learning to read and count to mastering finance, writing skills, public speaking, black history, civic studies, U.S. constitution, Spanish, Greek, and Latin languages, and SMARTE (Science, Math, Art, Robotics & Engineering) - our classes are designed to ignite a passion for learning and empower your child. Please note that CHESS does offer its virtual e-learning student co-op classes. Parents are responsible for ensuring that their children complete any missed assignments before the next scheduled class time.

CLASS REGISTRATION

Co-op day offers a structured homeschooling experience where parents must enroll their children in classes corresponding to their age or grade level. The class materials are designed to be appropriate for the age and grade level of the children, ensuring that they can benefit from the educational structure and experience the necessary level of maturity to excel. For example, a child who demonstrates advanced reading abilities may not necessarily possess the required comprehension skills or level of maturity expected for that specific academic level. Our objective is to ensure that students maintain their focus and master the material with minimal interruptions.

TEACHERS

Our classes are parent-led. They do not receive payment for their teaching services. However, we do require families to purchase the necessary materials for each class. Occasionally, we invite experts from various fields to enhance our curriculum. In such cases, they may charge a reasonable fee for their services. The administration determines which classes will be offered; however, we are open to suggestions. All parents are required to participate in the class by either being the lead teacher, assisting the lead teacher, or helping facilitate the class. All parents bring unique skills, gifts, and talents to the classroom.

CO-OP FEES

The annual registration fee of only \$55 per family covers essential expenses, including insurance, web-hosting, and host facility fees. The cost of materials for classes can range from \$5 to \$45 per student, covering expenses such as copies and books. We make every effort to keep these costs low for our families. In the case of field trips, there may be additional expenses, and parents will be notified in a timely manner. Please note that all fees are subject to change.

HOUSERULES

At CHESS, we believe in respecting other people's property and maintaining a clean and organized environment. To maintain a spirit of excellence, we kindly ask all members to adhere to the following guidelines:

Cleanliness is key

We request donations for cleaning supplies such as toilet paper, paper towels, tissues, hand and dish soap, cleaning solutions, wipes, garbage bags, etc.

Kitchen guidelines

The stove/oven use is **NOT** permitted; you are welcome to use the microwave and refrigerator. Please wipe down these appliances after each use, leaving them clean and ready for others to enjoy.

Lunchtime guidelines

All families must bring their water, utensils, microwave-safe plates, and a healthy lunch that does not require cooking or heating in an oven.

Maintaining teaching/eating areas

We ask parents to monitor their children during teaching and eating times and clean up after them.

Purchase your <u>Co-op T-shirt</u> for \$12 per shirt on our website. Remember it must be worn every Wednesday.

Remember to bring your school supplies every week.

Drop-offs

Children are not permitted to be dropped off on co-op days unless the student is enrolled in KGCA. In extinguishing circumstances, if a parent is unable to participate in the co-op, their child may attend under the supervision of another responsible adult. This arrangement must be communicated to the Director in writing.

GRADES 6-12

Financial Literacy w/Junior Achievement
